<u>John 1:1</u>

The apostle John has always been considered the one who wrote the gospel of John. Jesus chose John as one of his twelve closest followers. John accompanied Jesus during the years Jesus went about performing miracles and proclaiming the good news of God's kingdom. John was there at the cross when Jesus died. Three days later, John ran to the empty tomb and confirmed that Jesus had risen from the dead. After Jesus came back to life; John ate and drank and hung out with Jesus for forty days. Then John was there to see Jesus lifted up into a cloud and taken up into heaven. John was an eye witness of all that Jesus said and did.
