John 4:4

In this passage Jesus and his students are on a journey. They were going to their Jewish towns in the land of Galilee. Their journey was about 70 miles, and they were probably walking. They were traveling through the land of the Samaritans. The Samaritans were a people who were half-Jew and half-non-Jew. Their religion was half-Jewish and half pagan. The Jews and the Samaritans hated and avoided each other. On his journey Jesus stopped to rest at a well near a town in Samaria, and talked to a Samaritan woman.

Think about John 4:7-9.

A woman from Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, "Give me a drink." ... The Samaritan woman said to him, "How is it that you, a Jew, ask for a drink from me, a woman of Samaria?" (For Jews have no dealings with Samaritans.)

- 1. What did Jesus say to begin talking to this woman?
- 2. What question did the woman ask Jesus? Why did she ask Jesus this?
- 3. Why do you think Jesus did not obey the social customs between Jews and Samaritans?

Think about John 4:10.

Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God, and who it is that is saying to you, 'Give me a drink,' you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water."

- 1. What two things did the woman not know?
- 2. If the woman had known these two things, what would she have done differently?
- 3. If the woman had asked, what would Jesus have given to her?
- 4. What do you think Jesus meant by saying he gives living water? (John 7:37-39)

Think about John 4:11-13.

The woman said to him, "Sir, you have nothing to draw water with, and the well is deep. Where do you get that living water? ... Jesus said to her, "Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again,

- 1. What problems did this woman think Jesus would have for him to give her water?
- 2. What problem did Jesus say everyone would have, who drinks water from that well?

Think about John 4:14.

(Jesus said to her) but whoever drinks of the water that I will give him will never be thirsty again. The water that I will give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life.

- 1. What must we do with the water that Jesus gives, if we are never to be thirsty again?
- 2. How can we do that? (John 15:4)
- 3. What does Jesus' water become in those who take it?

Think about John 4:19-20.

The woman said to him, "Sir, I perceive that you are a prophet. Our (Samaritan) fathers worshiped on this mountain, but you (Jews) say that in Jerusalem is the place where people ought to worship."

1. What did this woman think was important for those who worship God?

Think about John 4:21-24.

Jesus said to her, "Woman, believe me, the hour is coming when neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem will you worship the Father. ... But the hour is coming, and is now here, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for the Father is seeking such people to worship him. God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth."

2. What did Jesus say was important for those who worship God?

Think about John 4:25-26.

The woman said to him, "I know that Messiah is coming (he who is called Christ). When he comes, he will tell us all things." Jesus said to her, "I who speak to you am he."

- 1. What two things did this woman say about the Messiah?
- 2. What did Jesus say about the Messiah?
